In the Matter of the Naturalization of William Johnson an Alien.

Be it Remembered, that on the 1st day of August 1911 in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and ninety one personally appeared before George C. Meyler Presiding Judge of the County Court of the County of Arapahoe and State aforesaid (the name being William Johnson an alien, above Court House in Denver in the County aforesaid, William Johnson an alien, above age of twenty-one years, and applied to the said Court to be admitted to become a Naturalized Citizen of the United States of America, pursuant to the several Acts of Congress heretofore passed on that subject; and the said William Johnson having thereupon produce to the Court record testimony showing that he has heretofore reported himself and filed his Declaration of his Intention to become a Citizen of the United States, according to the provisions of the said several Acts of Congress and the Court being satisfied, as well from the oath of the said William Johnson and from the testimony of Joseph J. Wendt and William Johnson who have resided within the limits and under the jurisdiction of the United States for at least five years last past, and at least one year last past within the State of Colorado, and that during the whole of that time he behaved himself as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles contained in the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same, and two years and upward having elapsed since the said William Johnson reported himself and filed his Declaration of his Intention as aforesaid, IT WAS ORDERED that the said William Johnson be admitted to all the rights, privileges and immunities of a Naturalized Citizen of the United States, and that the same be certified by the Clerk of this Court, under the Seal of said State, State and Sovereignty whatever, and more particularly to George C. Meyler Judge, Charles T. Larson Sheriff, William Johnson Clerk, and William Johnson State's Attorney hereof he was heretofore a subject, which said oath having been administered to the said William Johnson by the Clerk of said Court, it was ordered by the Court that the said William Johnson be admitted to all the regular the rights, privileges and immunities of a Naturalized Citizen of the United States, and that the same be certified by the Clerk of this Court, under the Seal of said
